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
A message from Lord Nathan

RAGOSINE / AUSTER HOMING CUP

This Cup has been presented to the Auster Flying Club by Mr. F. Wayman one of the Directors of the Ragosine Oil Co., and will be the main feature of another rally to be held at Rearsby in the early autumn.

This event will be open to all members of the Flying Club and Auster Owners and will take the form of a navigation competition, the winner of which will be awarded a replica of the Cup. The name of the winner will be inscribed on the Cup itself which will be retained by the Club on their premises.

Since Ragosine oil is recommended for use in Austers, all aircraft taking part in the navigation competition must be using this lubricant and a word about the Company would not be out of place.

The Ragosine Company which is 100% British was formed at London in 1883 with a capital of £560,000, and probably owed much of its original success to the degree of industrial development prevailing in England at that time. All was not plain sailing however, and in the early days of 1926 the Company became Limited. A new policy was formed based on the early tradition, loyalty and honest endeavour layed down by the founder many years before, which played a great part during the recent war when oil became a vital necessity.

Ragosine oils were chosen by the makers of the Spitfire, Wellington, Defiant, Hurricane, Lancaster, Skua and Sunderland amongst others, for the flight tests and delivery flights. In fact every Spitfire going off the assembly line was filled with this lubricant, so it may be said that together with the makers of the Spitfire and the indomitable courage of our fighter pilots, Ragosine played a leading part in winning the "Battle of Britain".

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True the Auster Flying Club is only open to employees of Auster Aircraft Ltd., but the Leicestershire Aero Club is already established on Ratcliffe Aerodrome and membership is obtainable on payment of £2 2s. entrance fee together with £3 3s. Od. subscription. Flying charges are £2 an hour. The comfortable club house and bar can be made a common meeting ground for friends on summer evenings and weekends.

For those who find their pockets will not stretch so far, the new Royal Air Force Association (Leicester) Flying Club offers flying to all, ex-service men and general public alike, at £2 15s. 0d. an hour dual and £2 an hour solo. Entrance fees are ex-services 10/6d., general public £1 ls. 0d., and although the Club is not completely established, for the time being they will operate from Rearsby, using the Auster Flying Club's new premises.

If you do not wish to belong to any Club, Auster Aircraft Limited operate a flying school at Rearsby from which everyone can obtain flying instruction from an experienced ex-R.A.F. Flying instructor. The prices are £3 an hour dual, and £2 an hour solo for members of recognised flying clubs, and £3 5s. 0d. per hour dual, and £2 5s. 0d. per hour solo for other applicants. Joy rides and charter work are also undertaken by this flying school.

Continental Deliveries of Rearsby will also carry out charter flights so Leicester business men may have no excuses for being late or tired for business appointments. The hire of a 100 h.p. Auster 3-seater at 1/- a mile will take them to any part of the country in one third of the time it takes by road.

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
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
